

## <u>Sermon Discussion Guide – Altars in Unlikely Places</u>

- 1. Are there things in your life or family with which you have become too comfortable? Is it time to get frustrated? What could happen if you changed your perspective on those things?
- 2. Do you feel stuck in life right now? Do you believe that God wants to use you? What will it take for you to walk in freedom?
- 3. According to Acts 16:25, Paul and Silas were praying and singing in prison. Where do they find the strength to continue worshipping in this situation?
- 4. Tell about a time you worshipped God on the mountaintop. Have you been drawn to worship in the valley as well? How are those experiences similar and how are they different?
- 5. In verse 30 of Acts 16, the jailer came to Paul and Silas and asked what he needed to do to be saved. How did their response to this whole situation impact the jailer and his family?
- 6. Matthew 6 tells us to pray to our Father "who is in secret." When has God taken prayer from your secret place and transferred it to work in your tight place? How about the public place?
- 7. What would it look like for you to build an altar and worship in your situation today?
- 8. How is God personally challenging you to respond to this message?
