- 1. Racial Reconciliation and/or Racial Justice?
- 2. Ephesians 2:14-18; John 17:20-21; Acts 1:8; Acts 2:1-12; Acts 8:26-40; Acts 10 and Acts 13:1 (NIV)
- 3. Racial Reconciliation is focused on Diversity.
- 4. Racial Justice is focused on Discipleship.
- 5. Racial Reconciliation is focused on the Inside of the Church.
- 6. Racial Justice is focused on the Outside of Church and society.
- 7. We should dissect systems for expressions of White dominance.
- 8. Race is a system designed to maintain power and control.
- 9. 2 Corinthians 5:17-20 NIV
- 10. The Church is seen as irrelevant and our message of reconciliation hollow because we exclude racial justice.
- 11. The whole Church taking the whole gospel to the whole world.
- 12. Matthew 13:24-30 NIV
- 13. The White Evangelical Church has been seen as an enabler to racial injustice. *(Indifference)
- 14. The Black Church has been ignorant of it's role in the great commission. *(Ignorance)
- 15. So what do we do now? (First Be, then See, and then Do)

RACE AND FAITH SEMINAR SESSION #2. Faith: "Moving Forward"

- 1. Live Communally rather than Individually.
- 2. Pray for a new theology of your city.
- 3. Acknowledge White Identity and Privilege.
- 4. Recognize this is spiritual warfare.
- 5. Become a modern day Abolitionist.
- 6. Don't blame anti-Christian groups for doing what the Church has been called to do.
- 7. Educate others through preaching and social relationships.
- 8. Reject the idolatry of race and embrace the identity and image afforded by grace.
- 9. Submit to a person different than you (minority) rather than self-diagnose and self-treat.
- 10. Listen to the stories of ethnic minorities without dismissing their journey or experiences.
- 11. Stretch beyond your stamina limits and comfort zone.
- 12. Befriend the National Black Fellowship of the Assemblies of God.
